FROM THE MAYOR

A Message From Mayor Ronald J. Gardiner

The weather has finally decided to “play nice”. This spring is the wettest and coldest one that I can remember. The dreary spring has given way to a fresh and invigorating summer and the Village of Glenwood is poised to move forward with great plans and expectations.

I have ordered an assessment of the street surfaces throughout the entire town and we will be embarking on an aggressive resurfacing program starting with the worst sections of road. The finding for this work will come from the annual Motor Fuel Tax allotment from the State of Illinois as well as the proceeds from our recently enacted fuel tax. I had the fuel tax proceeds earmarked for rehabilitation of Glenwood infrastructure. We have submitted several projects to the State Legislature with the hopes of some of them being included in the Governor Pritzker’s Capital Improvement Budget. These items include water tank rehad at the Komer Pumping Station, Water Main Replacement throughout town, Fire Hydrant and Water Valve Replacement as well as more street resurfacing and sidewalk replacement.

Work has commenced on the crumbling bridge that travels south on Glenwood – Chicago

Heights Road to our Industrial Park. This is the culmination of several months of negotiations with IDOT. This bridge is in danger of collapse and the whopping \$2.3 Million cost will be the burden of the State of Illinois. The State demanded that we take ownership of this bridge after they rebuilt it, but I refused this demand and got to a point where they agreed to do the work and maintain the bridge in their stock for the future. I apologize for any inconvenience this may be causing you, but we have worked with our business partners to assure that they have alternative travel plans as this project will not be completed until November of this year.

The final plans and specs are being worked on to begin the work on the Arquilla Park Flooding Project. The acquisitions will complete in the next few months and the final plans can reflect a new vision of the flood wall to enhance the safety of adjoining properties. I will be working with Staff, the Board and Residents to develop plans for the new Park, Ball Fields, Basketball and other amenities, but the flood project work will be ongoing in the spring of 2020. I am officially announcing my First Annual “Golf for the Kids” Fund Raising Golf Outing. We will be working with all of the youth sports organizations in the Village to promote this event and guarantee a large crowd.

I am looking for volunteers

to assist with this project. Put the date of August 17, 2019 on your social calendars. Put together a foursome and come out to support the youth in our Community. The entire proceeds of the day will be equally split between the organized sport organizations. The day will include a “goody bag” for each registered golfer, lunch “at the turn” as well as refreshments on the course. Dinner will be available at the end of the day for purchase in the Grill Bar.

The revitalization of the Glenwood Plaza is top on my priority list. Now that we have the basic infrastructure installed we can focus all of our efforts on the construction of new businesses. Please take some time to visit the new Anytime Fitness as well as the Good Vet. These two businesses occupy the second building in the new Lincoln Crossings with the first being the new Burger King. We need to make sure that we are patronizing these businesses to assure that they are prosperous and thrive. We have received hundreds of suggestions on occupants for the plaza and we have followed up with each one of them. The unfortunate part is that the decision making people normally just look at the available statistics and never take the time to get to know our great little village. I have doubled down with the efforts to fill the center. If you have interest in voicing your thoughts on what should go there, please drop me a line or make an entry on our Village Website.

Summer affords us the privilege of extended daylight hours and the increased safety that the light affords in our residential neighborhoods. I am embarking on a program to offer new LED High Efficiency – Low Operational Cost light fixtures to willing residents who will have these bright lights installed on their homes in place of the coach light at their front doors. The concept is that every house in Glenwood has a coach light at the side of their front door. The changing of this fixture to a broadcast light will wash light across their front yard as well as into the public way and street. The cost of installation of conventional street lights is something that we could not afford without creating a special tax or taxing district. This project has been successful in older neighborhoods and should help us to “Light Up Glenwood”.

In closing I would ask that anyone who would like to serve on any Village committee, commission or group please take a minute to send me your desire. I would like to fill out all positions. I would also like to congratulate Police Chief Derrick Peddycord on his promotion to Chief Of Police. Chief Peddycord was chosen from a pool of candidates that excelled in Police Administration. We look forward to many years of great leadership of our fine Glenwood Police Department.

Please enjoy your summer and reach out to me if I can be of any assistance to you.

SUMMER

Is here!

I am sad to report that we lost a great person recently with the untimely passing of Wayne Washington. Wayne has been our Village Electrical Inspector for many years and his dedication to the Village will be sorely missed, not only as our Inspector, but in all of his community involvements especially with youth sports. Rest In Peace, my Friend. We miss you.

This spring has been quite challenging for your Inspectors as we continue to battle the grass and weeds that have been growing like wildfire with all the rain! By the time this newsletter gets into your hands we will most likely be in the heat of the summer and the grass will have settled down for a while. If you experienced a notice to cut your grass or had to live with a neighbor's property that was not attended to rapidly, I will say that we will continue to monitor all properties as we blaze through the summer and get into the fall season where the grass will sprout up once again.

The Village is currently broken down into five Property Maintenance Divisions with an Inspector assigned to each. The process to monitor grass and weeds has the Inspectors canvassing their respective

areas and placing the five day Red Warning Cards on any property where grass or weeds are approaching 6". The Red Card is a courtesy notice that you must remedy the situation in the five days. Each Friday, Saturday and Sunday thru the growing season, the Inspectors travel their areas and create a list of those properties that did not heed the notice and need to be cut. These properties are placed on the "cut list" that is transmitted to the cutting contractor who cuts them by the following Thursday. Properties that the Village cuts are then billed for the service. If the bill is not paid, the property is issued a violation notice and through the Adjudication Court a fine is then assessed and the balance due will remain with the property as a debt to the Village for collection.

Inspectors are also monitoring the neighborhoods for the deteriorating conditions of dead or dying trees, peeling or chipping paint, gutter cleaning or damage as well as rubbish and trash issues. Your Inspectors are also working to remove any "inoperable" vehicles from property. We have seen an increase in cars being stored under covers and starting mid-summer we will start to

work on the removal of these vehicles as well. If you would like a non-binding inspection of your property to see how you stack up against your neighbors or if you have a concern or complaint about any other property, please give us a call so that we can check it out.

This heavy rain this spring has us concerned about mosquito populations. We are checking all properties for pools that may or may not be registered with us. ALL pools in town must be registered and inspected annually. More importantly, we must know of any pool that is not being used, these pose the highest risk for mosquito production. If you are a pool owner you must either have your pool sanitary, and chlorinated or you must remove the pool and return the area to original. This is a MAJOR concern of ours and I ask that you notify us if you know of a pool in your neighborhood that may need attention.

We also inspect all rental properties annually, but continue to find rentals that we do not have registered. If you know of a house in your area that is being

rented and not occupied by the owner, please let us know. Any property sold in the Village must be inspected prior to sale and any code violations must be corrected. If you are considering a sale give us a call early so we can work with you to assure a smooth process.

We are currently working with some of the property owners on our east side to annex them into the Village so that we can effect property maintenance and housekeeping compliance. These properties currently lie outside of our corporate boundaries along Glenwood-Lansing Road, Cottage Grove Avenue and Glenwood-Dyer Road. These properties lie on main routes of entry to our town and are not good representations of our town.

NEWS FROM THE GLENWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT



The implementation of the new Paramedic Ambulance Service has been a resounding success. We began ALS Transport services on February 1, 2018 after contracting for several years for the transport portion of the response. The driving force behind this transition was to provide a higher level of service to our residents while preparing for the challenges that have been presented with the closure of St. James Hospital in Chicago Heights.

Our first year of operation presented many new horizons for us as we built our program of excellence and met the higher need and expectations that the residents demand. We responded to a total of 1897 calls for service in this first year, 1253 of these were for medical assistance. The average

response time to the scene of the call has been greatly reduced, down to just under 4.2 minutes. We have recognized only very minor increases in transport times with the closure of the hospital. The overall success of the program can also be measured in the fact that the collections for service have outpaced the contract costs by over \$118,000!

We are currently completing a Firefighter Basic Skills Academy and will be graduating 5 Recruits. The Academy has been instructed by our senior Firefighters. The Candidates will receive State of Illinois Fire Marshall certification at the completion of the class that has seen over 250 hours of didactic training as well as over 100 hours of practical sessions. We have also implemented a web based advanced skill training program

that enhances our ability to deliver continuing education as well as document each hour of firefighting and EMS Training that the Firefighter gets.

Public Education continues to be our mission. We have recently participated in Career Days at the schools, the School Fun Fair, Senior Center presentations and Homeowner Association meetings. If you are affiliated with a group or organization and would like a fire or personal safety presentation, please contact the FD at 1-708-753-2440. We also offer Child Car Seat certified installations, call the FD for an appointment.

As we enter the summer months please remember that Illinois does not allow any type of Fireworks. While it is nearly impossible to eliminate the

devices, we **STRONGLY** ask that you steer clear of these devices. In recent years we have experienced two garage fires, three moderate personal injuries and numerous reports of property damage from fireworks ignited by untrained people. Come out and enjoy the Glenwoodie Fireworks Show on the 4th of July.

As a reminder, any form of "open burning" is prohibited in Glenwood. You are only allowed to have outdoor fires in approved and covered Fire Pits. Summer is also a great time to examine your home, business and property to "clear the clutter" take time to make your environment safer for you and yours.

POOL SAFETY

- Never leave a child in or near a pool alone
- Teach children how to swim
- Install proper barriers, covers, alarms, and fences on & around your pool or spa
- Visit www.poolsafely.gov/parents

BIKE SAFETY

- Wear a properly fitted helmet
- See and Be Seen--wear bright colors. Reflectors must be on bikes and bike lights on at night is the law.
- Visit the NHTSA (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration) at www.nhtsa.dot.gov

FIREARMS SAFETY IN THE HOME

- ALL GUNS ARE ALWAYS LOADED-LOCK THEM UP AND KEEP THEM SECURED AND OUT OF REACH!!!

KIDS HOME ALONE

- Set up "House Rules" establish what is / what is not allowed
- Get home safely, never take a ride from a stranger.

Also, with school being out for the summer it is even more important to DRIVE SAFELY and follow the rules of the road, especially with children outside playing, bicyclists, motorcyclists, pedestrians, etc... Remember to "Look Twice and Save a Life".

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS:

- Install porch, yard, and motion detector lights
- Trim your bushes, hedges, and other vegetation that can provide hiding places for criminals
- Lock car doors and don't leave valuables inside your car
- Don't give out personal

information over the phone

- Don't hide valuables in popular places such as dresser drawers, bedroom closets or freezers. Those are the first places burglars look. Use safes for jewelry and weapons. Favorite items to steal are cash, jewelry, electronic equipment and games, silver, guns and items easily sold to pawn shops, second-hand stores or on the street.

- Burglars want to spend no more than 60 seconds breaking into a home, so make entry more time-consuming by installing deadbolt locks on doors and locks on windows. Consider a home security or surveillance system.

- Make a special effort to secure the front door, back door and first-floor windows because those are the places thieves are most likely to gain entry.

- Get to know your neighbors and report any suspicious activity!

In 2012, the residents approved a resolution to have the Village manage a Municipal Aggregation program. The Village seeks competitive pricing for the residents' home bills and has been very successful since the inception of the program. The Village's current Municipal Aggregation pricing is 7.443 cents/kWh through October 2020.

ComEd issues residential pricing annually. They just released their pricing for June 2019 to May 2020 at 7.063 cents/kWh. This new ComEd price would lower the average resident's bill by \$3 per mo. Residents who would like to opt out of the program and return to ComEd would need to call 1-844-351-7691.

- I understand that the services under this program shall not be prioritized nor shall there be any obligation or liability owed by the Village of Glenwood in the event a qualified applicant's driveway is not, from time to time, plowed. Driveways will be plowed in a timely manner; however, there may be occasions when the resident will need to be patient.
- I am the owner and reside 12 months of the year at the single-family dwelling listed above.
- I hereby release the Village of Glenwood and its agents, employees, contractors and snow plow operator(s) from all liability and/or property damage arising out of the removal of snow from the bottom portion of my driveway apron at the residence listed above.
- I understand that the Village and its snow plow operator(s) shall not be liable for damage to driveways, curbs, or parkways and will not be responsible for spring clean-up of debris due to the plowing of this program.

- I understand the bottom portion of my driveway apron will only be plowed after a snowfall of **4 OR MORE INCHES** and **ONLY AFTER** all of the Village streets have been cleared to the satisfaction of the Public Works Director. The removal may take up to 48 hours after the snowfall. We will not be able to clear the snow on Saturdays or Sundays.
- I understand it is my obligation to make sure the driveway is clear of all obstacles. The snow plow operator has the right to refrain from plowing the driveway if it is obstructed by obstacles.
