## *A Message from the Mayor*

Fall Greetings to all of you. Like all of you we are preparing for the challenges that winter brings, the leaves clogging the storm drains, the snow making travel treacherous and the deep freeze that brings all sorts of physical challenges. My pledge to you is that my Staff stands ready to handle all of these challenges and if you need emergency assistance, please do not hesitate to contact the Village Hall! We have been very busy these past few months as we Move Glenwood Forward. The annexation process for **T&J Meats** is complete. The owners are hard at work finalizing their plans for an expansion to a full grocery line that will include visible enhancements to the property that serves as a “Front Door” to our community. We welcome the Lilovich Family to Glenwood and will work diligently with them to assure an improved site for years to come.

The Town Center Plaza has seen a flurry of activity the past few months as we worked tirelessly with the owners and prospective tenants to fill the vacant spaces. I ask that you take time to visit the new merchants and patronize them. Small business will not flourish in our community unless we make every effort to “buy local” and support the business people who have chosen to locate here in Glenwood! **Emporium Liquors** has moved a storefront east and completely remodeled making room for the **Food Hub**, a full service grocer with a fresh deli, meat market and produce section. Stop in and they will cook your food on site to take home! **Krazy Hog BBQ** brings the best in barbeque fare to their new store, dine in or carry out. **Mias Café** is set to open in the coming weeks for a relaxing venue to enjoy your leisure time. **A-1 Grille** carries a full line of prepared food, snacks and sandwiches. **Arrenello’s Pizza** continues to be a staple in the center and supply high quality Pizza and Italian Cuisine via carry out and delivery. They have been strong supporters of the Village for many years and I would like to thank the Matokars for their dedication to our town! **Chole’s Mexican** food is known far and wide for their excellent Mexican food offerings at very reasonable prices! I encourage you to try Chole’s. Plans are in the works to relocate the **Allstate Insurance Agency** and the **Planet Green Cremation, Inc.** to new store fronts in the plaza, thus freeing up space in the west building for the expansion of the **Little Scholars Child Development Center**. The Daycare Center is growing by leaps and bounds. Remodeling has begun on a Tee Shirt and Embroidery store that will locate in the east end of the former Byron’s Bicycle Shop.

I have established a business person’s committee to enhance the presence of our business leaders in helping to determine their needs and wants as we continue to grow our local business base. This group has met several times and has taken on the name of “The Glenwood Business Coalition – GBC”. Similar to local Chambers of Commerce, such as the Homewood Area Chamber of Commerce of which we and many of the businesses are members. This group will concentrate on the issues that are unique to a Glenwood business. It will not only identify their challenges, but have a voice in determining how the concerns can be positively addressed. The meetings are held monthly and will be hosted at different businesses to showcase what we have to offer right here in Glenwood.

The redevelopment of the Glenwood Plaza site continues to consume the majority of our time. You have seen demolition begin and signage improved. Behind the scenes we are working feverishly to provide a roadmap to total development that will allow us to expand the tax base to its maximum while providing the types of venues that you have been asking for. While there are many technical details to work out, it is our goal to begin the revitalization during the winter months. I will be mailing a complete update on this process in the very near future to each resident.

# *A Message from the Mayor Continued...*

The storm sewer system construction to alleviate overland flooding in the Old Glenwood Neighborhood is nearing completion. This is a project that has been ongoing all summer. Once completed this new line will connect any of the existing sewer lines directly to the creek and will allow us to expand the grid system in the future. Paving and restoration work is all that is left to be completed with the first phase of the project. It will be finished before winter settles in. Thanks for your patience during this project.

The intersection of 187<sup>th</sup> and Halsted Streets has been rehabilitated to allow for a right turn lane for westbound cars on 187<sup>th</sup> Street onto Halsted Street. This improvement will enhance the flow of traffic through the area and cut down on backups. This project was completed using IDOT Funding.

Work continues on the development of the site for the arrival of KLLM Trucking next to the NICOR property on Glenwood-Chicago Heights Road. In our Industrial North TIF, **Little Debbie Snack Cakes** has completed construction of their new distribution center on Holbrook Road as the industrial area continues to expand.

We have successfully completed a process to reinstate an Economic Development Grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce that will reimburse us for the regional detention pond and roadway improvements in the Industrial Park. This was a very complex process that included State and Federal parameters that had to be met. While the award has been granted, we are working closely with the US DOC to initiate payment.

The completion of the Hickory Glen Park renovation has provided us all with a park to be truly proud of, a park for all seasons, a park for everyone! Staff is currently working on a plan that will allow us to rehabilitate the Estates Park and Callahan-Strand Park in the spring. Once I have all the details I will be asking for citizen input to complete the design.

## **GLENWOOD FOREST HOMEOWNERS & RESIDENTS GROUP**

The Glenwood Forest Homeowners and Residents group had a great summer. We continued our regular monthly meeting at the Forest Fieldhouse on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month beginning at 6:30pm, and finish on time at 8:00pm. We really could use more individuals at the meetings, so that we can better serve the needs of our community.

During the months of November and December the meetings are moved to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday in order to adjust for the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

Our summer started out with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Memorial Day celebration. This year's event was held at the memorial for Lt. Derwin Williams, a Glenwood resident killed in Afghanistan, located in Veterans Park. A great big **THANK YOU** to the Bloom Township High School NJROTC Color Guard Team for providing the flag services for our celebration. The team was made up of C/LCDR Sandra Robles, C/Ltjg Jaime Flores, C/PO3 Natalie Chagolla and C/SN Angel Anaya. Also thank you Lt. Stacy L. Henderson, Senior Naval Science Instructor for the program.

We were also joined by a group from the Cook County Sheriff's Department headed up by Patrick McCool, who

is the Veterans Affairs coordinator for the department. Lt. Williams had been a member of the department.

Our next event was the Independence Day "We The People" parade on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Several members of the group marched in the parade. We pulled our float, and passed out buttons and candy to the spectators. It was a great time.

The theme of our float was "Stand Behind The Badge" showing our support for the Glenwood Police Department, headed up by Chief Cook. We are a lucky community to have such a professional police department protecting us.

We are putting together our programs for the fall and winter months. In October we had a Tai-Chi instructor come out to discuss what would be involved with setting up a group. We also have information concerning the proper use of the exercise equipment in the park. In November we will have several options we are working on, and will announce soon. In December we will have our Annual Dessert potluck for the holidays.

# Leaf Pick-Up Program

The Village Leaf Pick-Up Program will begin Tuesday, November 1, 2016 and continue each Tuesday through November.

Leaf bags will only be picked up if the following guidelines are met:

- LEAVES MUST BE IN BROWN YARD WASTE/LANDSCAPE BAGS.
- **LEAF BAGS ONLY** DO NOT NEED A HOMEWOOD DISPOSAL YARD-WASTE STICKER.
- BAGS MUST BE CURBSIDE BY 6:00 A.M.
- ALL OTHER YARD WASTE BAGS (GRASS, TWIGS, ETC.) MUST HAVE A HOMEWOOD DISPOSAL YARD WASTE STICKER AFFIXED TO THE BAG.

This is a service provided to the residents of Glenwood only.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR

I'm sure the leaves are falling as you are reading this. The Village has free leaf pick-up the 5 Tuesdays (your regular garbage day) in November. The leaves must be in brown paper bags but they DO NOT require a sticker. It would be very helpful if you could please clean the leaves in front of your home to keep the streets and storm sewers clear. We will be sweeping town once a majority of the leaves have fallen but any help is greatly appreciated.

Everyone knows that once the leaves are gone, temperatures start dropping and soon enough we will be seeing and shoveling snow. I ask for your help, cooperation, and understanding during snow events. Our main objective is to clear the streets during and after the snow has fallen. While doing this our trucks will put snow in your driveway. We plow the snow to clear the road and push it towards the curb. I know it's frustrating when you have just cleared your driveway and snow is put back at the end of it. This certainly is NOT done intentionally. The parking ordinance and signage state no parking after 2" of snowfall. If it's possible to park all vehicles in the driveway during the winter months this will help with

more efficient plowing and not require you to come out early in the morning to move your vehicle. If there is a fire hydrant close to your home and it starts to get buried during the winter, it would be helpful if you could keep it clear in case the fire department needs it.

The Public Works Department has 10 employees and is responsible for everything you see and don't see within Glenwood. The most important duty is supplying all the residents with clean safe water. We receive our water from Lake Michigan through Hammond, IN. We have two water pump stations and have storage in town of 6.4 million gallons. Our water is sampled twice a month at various locations throughout town as mandated by the IEPA. We also maintain the sanitary sewer system that consists of four lift stations and approximately 125,000 feet of sewer line. There is always a public works employee available 24 hours a day 365 days a year in case of an emergency. Please contact E-Com at 799-6403 and they will dispatch Glenwood Public Works to the site.

## EDA Grant

The U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration has awarded the Village of Glenwood a grant for the necessary improvements to the Industrial Park land that surrounds the NICOR Companies property on Glenwood-Chicago Heights Road. This grant held much promise for the development of this area, but stalled in federal procedure. We were able to work diligently to insure that money was not lost to other projects in the region. The award totals funds of just over \$2 million dollars and is exclusively for improvements to this land. The monies fund the construction of the required storm water detention that will serve the entire area thus allowing the majority of the acreage to be developed into tax paying businesses. The funds will also be used for various site improvements such as the new street, curb, gutter, water and sewer mains to serve the property. Once completed this area will house the expanded Westside Transportation Company as well as the Regional Training Center and Dock Facility for KLLM Transport.



# Glenwood Police Department & **tip411**

The Glenwood Police Department now allows the public to share important public safety information anonymously with police by sending them a secure text message about crimes or suspicious activity in Glenwood.

The Glenwood Police Department is launching [tip411](#), an internet based tool from [CitizenObserver](#) that enables the public to text message an anonymous tip to police and lets officers respond back in real-time to create an anonymous two-way conversation.

Anyone with a cell phone may send an anonymous tip to Glenwood Police Department by texting **GLENWOOD** and their message/tip to 847411 (tip411). Anonymous web tips can also be submitted right from the Village of Glenwood website.

“We believe the public is our greatest law enforcement resource,” said Glenwood Police Chief, Demitrous Cook. “tip411 allows a safe and secure way for our residents to share important information with police without the fear of retribution.”

The tip411 system is 100% anonymous, as the technology removes all identifying information before police see it and there is no way to identify the sender.

“This system has been successful in communities across the U.S.,” said Terry Halsch, President of tip411. “Departments have been helped tremendously by members of the public who have sent anonymous text messages to police with important information that often leads to arrests.” Those with questions are asked to call Glenwood Police Department at 708-753-2420.

# INSPECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

The Inspectional Services Division of the Fire Department is tasked with the assignment of Property Maintenance. This past summer we recrafted several of our ordinances to better equip the Inspectors to be able to impact property defaults much quicker. As we work thru the changes, we are now also able to issue more timely citations for issues such as grass and weeds that exceed 6" in height. The Inspectors are in attendance at each of the Neighborhood Meetings to interact and get feedback about what your concerns are. Having the ability to remediate these issues will have a great impact on the appearance of our neighborhoods.

## Alarm Permits

The Village of Glenwood REQUIRES that every alarm system installed in ANY building or property in the Village be properly registered. The purpose of the annual registration is to assure that your First Responders: Fire, Police or EMS maintain accurate information on your property so that in the event an alarm is activated and you are not on the premises someone with access to your property is able to be contacted to provide access. The risk here is great for all of the Emergency Services.

Alarm systems have now become the norm as opposed to a luxury. Alarm systems are now in over 55% of homes in metropolitan areas! As an example: The alarm activates for a medical emergency in the home, or a panic signal from within the building, the responding personnel are faced with a daunting decision, there is no evidence of anything out of the ordinary when they arrive! No one can be heard screaming from within, there is no sign of any forced doors

or broken windows, nothing can be seen from the ground level windows..... DECISION TIME: Do they break down the door or do other damage to make entry only to find that it was a signal malfunction and there is absolutely no problem in the house or do they simply report that it looks clear from the outside only to be called back at a later time when others return home to find their loved one injured inside?

The registration of alarm systems is paramount to the successful outcomes that brought you to install the system in the first place! Annual Registration is free for residential properties and \$75 for business properties. The risk here is that if you choose not to register your alarm system, even after you have heard why it is so important, when we respond to your location for an alarm you will be issued a citation that will carry a fine of \$50 to \$750 for each occurrence. Registration forms can be found on the Village website, at the Village Hall, Police Department or Fire Stations.

# GLENWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT

Winter holidays are the time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

## HOLIDAY DECORATING

- Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.

## HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING

Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.  
Keep children and pets away from lit candles.  
Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.

## CITIZEN CPR

The Fire Department currently has six certified CPR instructors who are available to schedule classes on an as-needed basis. Please contact the fire station for more information. We are planning on hosting regularly scheduled Citizen CPR classes in Spring 2017.

# RESIDENT REMINDERS

## RAIN BARRELS

The free rain barrel program will end on December 31, 2016. Be sure to order your rain barrels before this time. The free Rain Barrel Program is a cooperative effort with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District. An application to order your free rain barrels can be found at [www.villageofglenwood.com](http://www.villageofglenwood.com) or in the Village Hall. Applicants must be residents of the Village of Glenwood, must own the property they are requesting to put the rain barrels on, and must agree to properly use and maintain the barrels.

## GET YOUR "ROOT" CARD

Did you know that you receive 50% off golf, driving range, simulator and 50% Banquet Hall Rental at Glenwoodie?

It's true! To receive your ROOT Card, you must be a Glenwood Homeowner and you must be current on your property taxes and water bill. If the above requirements are met all you need to do is stop by Village Hall with a current Photo ID and your paid property tax bill to start enjoying the amenities of Glenwoodie. Each resident homeowner & their spouse is eligible to receive a free ROOT Card.

## OVERNIGHT PARKING

The Village Ordinance prohibits vehicle parking on streets between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. unless the vehicle displays a valid Village vehicle sticker. This prohibition does not apply to vehicle that are not registered in Glenwood only if an exemption has been requested from the Police Department prior to the issuance of any violation. Exemptions must be made by calling the Police Department at 708-753-2420 with the following information:

- 1) Name and address of the owner of the vehicle;
- 2) The color, make, model, and license plate number on the vehicle;
- 3) The dates the exemption will be required which shall not be for a period more than 7 days. The process can be repeated one time;
- 4) The address in front of which the vehicle will be legally parked.

The owner of a vehicle parked in violation shall be fined \$40.00 for each violation.

## LEAVES/SNOW REMOVAL

As a reminder, it is illegal to blow, rake or shovel your leaves into the street, this applies to snow as well. The leaves clog the storm drains and damage property, the snow will ice over and cause property or physical damage as the plows have already cleared the street. It is unlawful to work on vehicles in the street, it is further noticed that working on vehicles on your property shall only be allowed for vehicles properly licensed to that property. We are enhancing this enforcement ability as of the writing of this article.




