AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10-46(b) OF THE VILLAGE'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REQUIRE THAT RESTAURANTS AND CLUBS WITH LIQUOR LICENSES CLOSE WITHIN 30 MINUTES AFTER THE TIME THEY CAN NO LONGER SELL LIQUOR

WHEREAS, Section 10-46(b) of the Village of Glenwood's Code of Ordinances makes it unlawful to keep open for business or admit the public, or to permit the public or any person other than the licensee, his employees or members of his family, to remain in or on any premises in or on which alcoholic liquor is sold at retail during the hours within which the sale of liquor is prohibited but allows restaurants, clubs and hotels to remain open;

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village find and determine that it is in the best interest of the Village and public safety to amend Section 10-46(b) to require that restaurants and clubs with liquor licenses close within 30 minutes after the time they can no longer sell liquor.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Glenwood, Cook County Illinois, pursuant to their home rule powers as follows:

SECTION 1: AMENDMENT TO SECTION 10-46(b) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 10-46(b) of the Village of Glenwood's Code of Ordinances shall herein be amended, and following its amendment state as follows:

Sec. 10-46 – Hours for the sale of alcoholic liquor.

* * *

(b) it shall be unlawful to keep open for business or admit the public, or to permit the public or any person other than the licensee, his employees or members of his family, to remain in or on any premises in or on which alcoholic liquor is sold at retail during the hours within which the sale of liquor is prohibited; however, in the

case of restaurants, clubs and hotels, it shall be unlawful to keep open for business or admit the public, or to permit the public or any person other than the licensee, his employees or members of his family, to remain in or on any premises upon which alcoholic liquor is sold at retail during the time which is 30 or more minutes after the time when the sale of liquor is prohibited. In the case of a hotel, the hotel is not required to close so long as the areas where liquor is sold/consumed is closed within 30 minutes after the time when the sale of liquor is prohibited.

SECTION 2: HOME RULE.

This Ordinance, and each of its terms, shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such Ordinance should: (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law; or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the Village of Glenwood that to the extent that the terms of this Ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, this Ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 3: INVALIDITY.

In the event any portion of this ordinance is found to be invalid, the remaining portions of this ordinance shall be severable from any such invalid portion and enforced to the fullest extent possible.

SECTION 4: REPEALER.

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against other existing ordinances of the Village to the extent there may be any conflict. All existing ordinances of the Village which directly conflict with the terms of this Ordinance are herein repealed.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

WHEREAS, the Village of Glenwood held a public hearing on July 30, 2024 on its appropriation ordinance for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2024 and ending April 30, 2025, with at least 10 days' notice of such public hearing being given by publishing a notice in a newspaper published in Cook County and generally circulated within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the published newspaper notice giving notice of the date, time and place of the public hearing further notified the public that the appropriation ordinance could be viewed at the Village Hall; and

WHEREAS, the proposed appropriation ordinance was made conveniently available at the Village Hall for viewing and/or copying for at least 10 days prior to the adoption of this ordinance; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GLENWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the Village of Glenwood that to the extent that the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval and shall subsequently be published in pamphlet form as provided by law.
